Do's and Don'ts of a Whiteboard Challenge

Review this cheat sheet as your last-minute guide

DO

- Ask your interviewer questions to learn more about the brief
- Write down everything it will help show your process, and you can refer back to it.
- Think out loud. Walk your interviewer through what you're doing, and why.
- Keep an eye on the time, and pace yourself accordingly.
- If you make an assumption, that's okay just call it out to your interviewer \sqcap
- Lead the challenge by "running" the session, you'll show your presentation skills.



Take a deep breathe, smile, and remember that YOU GOT THIS.

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DONT

- Don't Jump right into a design solution without asking any questions.
- Don't get "in the weeds", worrying about details that are not important for the challenge.
- Don't use terms like "it's cool" or "I like it" to describe why you made a decision.
- Don't design a solution that doesn't address the core problems in the brief.
- Don't worry about making some assumptionsit's ok, just call them out.
- Don't keep working if you are confused about something. Ask!
